

### Hate speech PIL 'targets' BJP CMS: Court

New Delhi: SC on Tuesday criticised 12 "eminent" persons who together filed a PIL "targeting" CMS of BJP-governed states for alleged hate speeches while making a plea for framing guidelines to restrain constitutional functionaries and bureaucrats from breaching fidelity to constitutional morality, reports Dhananjay Mahapatra. Appearing for petitioners, senior advocate Kapil Sibal told a bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices B V Nagarathna and Joydip Bagchi that the country's atmosphere had become toxic and "it is only the SC which can and should remedy it." However, the CJ-led bench was quick to point out that the petition had selectively named individuals while highlighting the problem. "This petition is definitely targeting certain individuals as it leaves out others who routinely make such hate speeches. Let the petitioners not create an impression that it is targeting certain individuals." The petitioners, including Rookh Verma, Mohd Adep, Harsh Manral, Najeub Jung, John Dayal and Ashok Kumar Sharma had cited the alleged hate speeches of Himanta Biswa Sarma, Yogi Adityanath, Devendra Fadnavis, Pushkar Singh Dhami, Anant Kumar Hegde and Giriraj Singh, all of whom belong to BJP, in addition to certain remarks by some bureaucrats.

# SC: Compensation is not a substitute for punishment

## Slams Practice Of HCs Reducing Sentence Of Convicts On Payment

New Delhi: Sending a clear message to high courts and trial courts that a person convicted of a crime could not be let off with lenient punishment on agreeing to financially compensate the victim, Supreme Court on Tuesday said that such compensation could not be considered equivalent to or a substitute for punishment.

A bench of Justices Rajesh Bindal and Vijay Bhishoi said that undue sympathy for the accused while imposing an inadequate sentence would do harm to society and erode public trust in the justice system. It expressed concern over the "misplaced understanding" of various high courts in treating compensation as a substitute for a sentence.

"Compensation payable to the victim is only restitutory in nature, and it cannot be considered as equivalent to or a substitute for punishment. Punishment is punitive in nature, and its object is to create an adequate deterrence against the said crime and to send a social

message to the miscreants that any violation of the moral norms of society would come with consequences, which cannot merely be purchased by money," Justice Bhishoi, who penned the judgment, said.

The bench quashed a Madras high court order that had reduced a three-year jail term in an attempt to murder case to the sentence undergone by them (two months), after the two persons convicted agreed to pay Rs 50,000 each to the victim. It said the HC had acted in defiance of the law and made a travesty of established criminal jurisprudence in arriving at its conclusion.

"The consideration to be kept in mind while awarding punishment is to ensure that the punishment should not be too harsh, but at the same time, it should also not be too lenient so as to undermine its deterrent effect... The objective of punishment is not to seek vengeance for the crime; rather, it is an attempt to reconstruct the damaged social fabric of society in order to pull back its wheel on the track," the bench said.

SC said the provision of compensation had its roots in victimology, which acknowledges victims as the "primary

sufferers of the crime" and advocated the idea of providing some relief from suffering.

"The rationale behind victim compensation is to rehabilitate the victim for the loss and injury caused to them as a direct consequence of the crime or offence and not to exonerate the offender/accused from their culpability. The practice of enhancing the compensation payable to the victim and reducing the sentence, especially in cases of grave offence, is dangerous as it might send a wrong message to society that offenders/accused persons can absolve themselves from their liability by merely paying a monetary consideration," it said.

"The misplaced understanding of various courts in treating compensation as a substitute for sentence is not both a matter of concern and a practice which should be condemned," SC said, adding that it had observed a "trend" in HCs to reduce the sentences awarded by trial courts "capriciously and mechanically, without any visible application of judicial mind".

### IIT-R student's body fished out of Ganga canal after 6 days

Roorkee: The body of a 30-year-old IIT-Roorkee student who was swept away in the fast-flowing Ganga canal six days ago at Valmiki Ghat there was fished out near Mohammadpur Jhal area of Manglaur located 17 km downstream in Haridwar district on Tuesday, police said.

Ashish Shukla, a second-year MBA student, was a resident of Gokulnagar in Uttar Pradesh's Varanasi district. He had gone to Valmiki Ghat near the Roorkee Municipal Corporation office with friends on Feb 11 evening. Police said he lost his balance while getting up from the steps of the ghat and fell into the deep canal around 7pm.

His friends tried to rescue him by tying their clothes to form a makeshift rope, but were unsuccessful as Shukla was unable to grab it and was swept

away. A Jal Police unit and local divers launched a search operation the same night but failed to trace him.

The next day, canal water was regulated from Haridwar to aid the search. State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and Army's Bengal Engineer Group (BEG) personnel joined Jal Police in efforts to trace Shukla, but could not locate him.

After five days, the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) was roped in and a massive operation was launched on Monday with a joint team of 100 personnel. They conducted a five-hour search covering a 17-km stretch using sonar and underwater drones.

The search resumed Tuesday morning and officials spotted the body. "We conducted the post-mortem and handed over the body to the family," SP (Rural) SC Sanyal said.

### Deceased girl's kin get death threats

Patna: The family of an 18-year-old NEET aspirant who died under suspicious circumstances in Patna last month received a second death threat note on Tuesday, even as police maintained round-the-clock security at their residence in Bihar's Jehanabad district, reports Faryal Rumi.

The threats came amid a CBI probe into the girl's death. She was found in a coma in her hostel room in Patna on Jan 6 and died on Jan 11. Forensic findings, including traces of semen on her clothes and signs of a struggle, suggested sexual assault, contradicting the police's initial claim of suicide and prompting transfer of the case to CBI.

# Black boxes in Baramati Learjet crash that killed Ajit damaged in fire: AAIB

Mumbai: The two independent black boxes of the Learjet aircraft that crashed at Baramati airport, killing the then Maharashtra deputy CM Ajit Pawar, sustained fire damage, the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau said on Tuesday. The AAIB said specialised support from the manufacturer was sought to retrieve data from one of the recorders, the cockpit voice recorder.

The Digital Flight Data Recorder (DFDR), manufactured by L3-Communications, was successfully downloaded at the AAIB Flight Recorder Laboratory, it said. The DFDR records technical parameters of the flight like aircraft speed, altitude and heading. "The Cockpit Voice Recorder (CVR), manufactured by Honeywell, is undergoing detailed technical examination. Assistance has been sought from accredited representative of the state of manufacture for specialised support in data retrieval," it

said. The CVR records conversation between the pilots, the radio communications with the air traffic controller and ambient noises in the cockpit. "Both recorders were exposed to intense heat for a prolonged period during the accident and sustained fire damage," it said.

On Jan 28, a Learjet-45 aircraft operated by charter company VSR Ventures crashed during approach and landing at Baramati airport, killing all five people on board. While the fire that

broke out after the accident left major portions of the fuselage charred, pictures from the accident site showed the tail section of the aircraft intact.

"Both the black boxes were installed in the tail section and that part of the aircraft was largely intact. In fact, cartons and other cargo stored in the tail section can be seen strewn around in the wreckage with hardly any fire damage. So how did the black boxes sustain so much fire damage?" asked Capt Amit Singh, an air

safety expert. Black boxes like DFDR and CVR are placed in metal armour and insulation to survive the impact, high temperatures and pressure.

Sena UBT MP Sanjay Raut said the damage to CVR was "mysterious" and "very serious". The comments came in the backdrop of allegations by NCP (SP) MLA Rohit Pawar last week. He had hinted at possible conspiracy and sabotage in the crash. Among the allegations he levied against VSR Ventures was one about the CVR. Pawar said he learned from the company's former employees that they regularly kept the CVR switched off on most flights. It is illegal to keep the CVR off.

The wait now is for the preliminary report, which under investigation norms should be submitted to the International Civil Aviation Organisation within 30 days of an accident. The investigating state, India in this case, can decide whether to release the preliminary report to the public or keep it confidential.

### Sunetra Pawar meets Fadnavis, seeks CBI probe

Mumbai: Deputy CM Sunetra Pawar and other NCP members on Tuesday met CM Devendra Fadnavis and demanded a CBI probe into the Jan 28 air crash that killed Ajit Pawar.

NCP state chief Sunil Tatkare told reporters that the CM had assured them the state govt would communicate with the Union home ministry. "The govt has already initiated a probe by independent agencies and has said it will order a CBI investigation. We feel a probe by the central agency would be comprehensive," Tatkare said. Sunetra Pawar, accompanied by her elder son Parth Pawar and others, handed over to the CM a letter seeking a CBI probe.

Ajit Pawar and four others were killed in a plane crash in Baramati.

In the letter, the NCP stated that "multiple aspects surrounding the incident give rise to legitimate apprehensions requiring investigation by an independent central agency," TNN & AGENCIES

# Groping & untying her pyjama string is attempt to rape: SC

## Sets Aside Allahabad HC's Controversial Judgment

New Delhi: Supreme Court on Tuesday ruled that groping a female and untying her pyjama string constituted "attempt to rape" and set aside Allahabad HC's controversial judgment terming the offence not an "attempt" but "preparation to commit rape", which attracts less punishment, being categorised as outraging the modesty of a woman.

The HC's March 17, 2025 judgment had created a furor and SC took suo motu cognisance of the case after a letter from NGO 'We the Women' through founder president and senior advocate Shobha Gupta.

A bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices Joydip Bagchi and N V Anjaria set aside the HC judgment and revived the original stringent charge of attempt to rape against the two persons under Posco Act.

Referring to pleas by Gupta and senior advocate H S Phoolka for greater sensitivity in judges while dealing with sexual offences against women, the bench said, "No judge or judgment of any court can be expected to do complete justice when it is inconsiderate towards the factual realities of a litigant and the vulnerabilities which they may be facing in approaching

a court of law." Writing the judgment, CJ Kant said the efforts of judges "must not only be grounded in the sound application of constitutional and legal principles but also foster an environment of compassion and empathy. The absence of either of these cornerstones would prevent judicial institutions from properly performing their crucial duties."

The bench said, "Our decisions as participants in the legal process, from laying down the procedure that shall have to be faced by common citizens to final judgment passed in any given case, must be the ethos of compassion, humanity and understanding, which are essential for creating a fair and just justice system."

SC said it had laid down principles to set judges and so would refrain from taking an open-ended approach to devise fresh guidelines without any. It requested National Judicial Academy for Justice Anuruddha Bose to constitute a committee of experts to prepare a "comprehensive report 'Developing Guidelines to Inculcate Sensitivity and Compassion into Judges and Judicial Process in the Context of Sexual Offences and Other Vulnerable Cases'." "The guidelines, we expect, will not be heavy, complicated expressions borne from foreign languages and jurisdictions," said the bench, which had termed then CJ D Y Chaudhry's "Handbook on Combating Gender Stereotypes" too "Harvard-oriented".

# Identical twins, identical scores (285) in JEE Main

Mumbai/Jaipur: In a city crowded with toppers and tight schedules, brothers Mahroof Ahmed Khan and Masroor Ahmed Khan in Kota stand out for an almost uncanny symmetry. The twins, who share the same shoe size and eyeglass power, studied together, tested together, sat the same JEE Main (Session 1) 2026 shift and walked away with identical marks till the last digit—285 out of 300, an NTA score of 99.998. Under NTA rules, candidates must declare if they are twins while filling out forms for the same competitive exam. Such candidates are made to take the exam in the same shift to ensure the integrity of exams like JEE and NEET. Their story began in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, and moved, like so many other JEE journeys, to Kota in 2023.

Known for cracking Olympiad exams, the brothers hoped the city's coaching ecosystem would sharpen them for bigger tests ahead, and turned friendly rivalry into a full-time study tool. "The twins came here sharing not just classrooms and notes, but an entire rhythm of preparation. Born on May 7, 2008, they have moved in parallel lines for as long as they can remember—same school, same coaching, same ambition," said Prof. Amit Ahuja, career

counsellor at Allen Career Institute. Behind this effort was a vision that reshaped the family. Their mother, Dr. Zeenat Begum, a gynaecologist who had been king for Odisha govt since the put her career on hold to matriarch with her sons. For three she managed their routines, health, and morale, becoming quiet constant in a high-pressure environment.

Zeenat said the move to Kota was initially meant to be temporary. "Both of them got selected for International Science Olympiad 2023, and we came to Kota in that year, thinking we would for a few months till they prep for the Olympiad exam. But a few weeks, both said that they loved the environment and the structure here and decided to stay," she said. p.
